Monday	Notes:	<p>Objective: Students will develop a broad understanding of key concepts in the history of early America, 1812-1830.</p> <p>Lesson Overview:</p> <p>The key concepts for the period 1820-1848 center around an America that is: 1) commercializing, but in different ways based on region; 2) democratizing, which means changes to politics and culture, 3) expanding, which means conflict with native peoples and other nations, 4) questioning its values, which means new ideas in religion, women's and worker's rights, and abolition.</p> <p>We'll start with the market/commercial revolution.</p> <p>For the week, read:</p> <p>For LO 4.4, the textbook is weak.
